Call-in reservations for the winter 2013 workshops begin October 1, 2013. Call-in reservations for the spring and summer 2014 workshops begin January 2, 2014.

Scouts receive the National Park Service America the Beautiful Passport rate for the Arch tram rides and/or the movies at the Arch.
